Yard Sale - Planning for the upcoming Yard/Garage Sale continues.

Weeding – Your mulched areas were weeded earlier this month, but the weeds will be back. MANAGEMENT REPORT – Jorie Martin

Financials: The operating cash reserve non-designated balance is \$21,655.90 or 12% of the total budget. Operating reserve should be between 10 to 20 percent. The expenses for April were \$9,664.21 under budget. The association remains in a strong financial position.

Landscaping: The sod installation where trees were removed should be completed during the first part of June. If that date is missed, then will be delayed until fall.

Pavers: Requests have been made by homeowners to utilize pavers for driveway enlargement. Information on "best practice" and choices have been provided to the board. It is recommended that the "policy" for such pavers be added to the ARC Guidelines.

Power Washing: Management has presented information on a contractor who can provide bulk rate power washing of homes and patios, and will be bringing the water for the power washing. Thompson Power Washington is offering a bulk rate to Woodbrook Village based on the total number of jobs in both Woodbrook Village and Cross Creek. See the attachment,
